Recently, there was a student in our program who was struggling with certain movements in physical therapy, through INCLUDE he was able to improve his balance. For him, and many other students, the expressive movements help them to understand muscle control through dance. What makes the program so unique is how elements of occupational and physical therapy, classical music and classical ballet education are blended together to create a fun and enriching environment for our students.


