


### 2021 At-a-Glance



# **Highlights**

### **COVID-19 Response Fund Grants**

In May of 2021 3RCF initiated its final round of COVID-19 Response Fund Grants. The funds available had been raised from individuals and businesses in the community, and included significant donations from Battelle, All in WA – Seattle Foundation, the Group Health Foundation, and Anonymous donors. 3RCF approved 26 grants to local nonprofits to support their pandemic response which ranged from

adapting their services due to pandemic restrictions or responding to an increase in demand from their clients.

Nonprofits in Benton and Franklin counties faced the pandemic challenges with creativity, resourcefulness, and determination to meet the need. We applaud their work and are grateful to have had the ability to provide support.

### Social Determinants of Health Grants

In the Spring of 2021 3RCF was honored to be selected by the Benton Franklin Community Health Alliance to launch a grant cycle with \$414,795 in funds provided by the Greater Columbia Accountable Communities of Health. This was a targeted effort to identify organizations in our community that needed funding to address food insecurity, housing, and mental health. Through this application process, 9 projects

were selected to receive grants, including Chaplaincy Health Care, Communities in Schools, Domestic Violence Services, Lutheran Community Services, Pasco Union Firefighters Foundation, Second Harvest Inland Northwest, SARC, Teen Challenge Tri-Cities, and Therapeutic Riding of Tri-Cities. 3RCF applauds these organizations for their significant work on these critical issues.

### **Annual Grants**

3RCF continues to make a significant impact through our Annual Grant Cycle. This application-based process is open to 501c3 nonprofits in Benton and Franklin counties and supports a wide range of services from critical needs to youth programs to the

arts. In 2021 the combination of endowed funds and direct donations resulted in over \$198,000 in grants being awarded to 35 nonprofits. Through the Annual Grant Cycle 3RCF is evaluating and funding the current needs in our community.
