

Call for Applications Pamela and Scott Woodward Conservation Scholarship

The Pamela and Scott Woodward Conservation Scholarship was created by Tapteal Greenway in 2016. Tapteal Greenway is a nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting conservation, education and recreation along the lower Yakima River. This merit-based scholarship was created to further its educational mission while recognizing the significant contributions by the Woodwards to Tapteal Greenway and the Tri-Cities community.

The criteria for application include the following:

- The applicant must be a resident of Benton or Franklin County.
- The applicant must be a current high school senior entering their freshman year of college or a returning college student.
- Applicant must enroll as a full-time student in an accredited college or university in Washington State.
- Applicant must have a cumulative 3.0 GPA (on 4.0 scale).
- Applicant must have a demonstrated interest in conservation.
- This scholarship is not available to relatives of the Woodward Scholarship Selection Committee or the family of Pamela and Scott Woodward.

To apply, please provide the following:

Application & Narrative Questions (Attached).

Essay: Submit an essay (500 to 1000 words) telling us about your interest in conservation and describe in detail an example of a conservation related activity or service project you were involved in

References: Please provide two reference letters with your application. These letters should come from individuals who know you through your academic, work, or community involvement. Please do not submit references from family members.

Transcript: Include your full transcript from the school you are currently attending with your application, or have it sent directly to 3 Rivers Community Foundation.

Deadline: The competed application, along with reference letters, and school transcripts, must be postmarked by March 31, 2026. Any materials postmarked after this date will not be considered. Send fully completed application to:

Decision notification letters will be sent in May. One \$2,000.00 award will be distributed. The scholarship funds will be disbursed directly to the institution in the recipient's name, upon receipt of enrollment verification.
